PODER PAC ENDORSES RAQUEL TERÁN FOR CONGRESS IN AZ-03

The only national political action committee solely dedicated to electing pro-choice Democratic Latinas to Congress, PODER PAC is the latest group to endorse Raquel Terán's campaign.

WASHINGTON, DC – Today, PODER PAC, the first and only political action committee founded by and for Latinas to elect Pro-Choice, Democratic Latinas to Congress, is announcing the endorsement of former State Senator and Arizona Democratic Party Chair Raquel Terán to represent Arizona's 3rd congressional district. If elected, Terán would be the first Latina elected to Congress from Arizona.

"It is evident Raquel has the passion, energy, and vast community support to represent AZ-03," **said Maria Cardona, PODER PAC Founding Board Member**. "She has been a fierce leader for abortion rights in the state legislature and PODER PAC will be proud to have her representing Latinas in Congress."

About Raquel Terán

Raquel Terán is running for Arizona's third congressional district. For more than two decades, she fought for democracy by building a civic and political movement to lift up the voices of everyone in her community.

Raquel was born in Douglas, Arizona and raised in Agua Prieta, Sonora on the actual street that divides the United States from Mexico. In 2006, she saw anti-immigrant sentiment and legislation gaining momentum in Arizona. That year, at a local rally someone from Mi Familia Vota put a clipboard in her hand and because of her deep belief in democracy, equality, fairness, and family, Raquel started organizing in her community - and she hasn't been without a clipboard since.

In 2011, she helped bring together Democrats, Republicans, Independents, Latinos, union members, educators, and youth activists to do something that had never been achieved before, ousting a sitting legislator- Senator Russell Pearce – author of the notorious SB 1070 "show me your papers law." The same coalition came together again and rejected Joe Arpaio in 2016.

Raquel traded her megaphone for a microphone when she was elected to the Arizona House of Representatives in 2018. In 2021, I was appointed to the Arizona Senate and also elected Chair of the Arizona Democratic Party. And with our democracy under attack, that same coalition that defeated Pearce and Arpaio came together to reject the GOP extremists in 2022 and elect a Democratic Governor, Secretary of State, and Attorney General for the first time in decades.

If elected, Terán would be the first Latina elected to Congress from Arizona.
