About Martha Guerrero

Martha Guerrero is a proud mom and public servant who has dedicated her life to lifting up others and delivering real results. A licensed social worker, legislative advocate, and Mayor of West Sacramento, Martha has spent her career helping working families get ahead.

The youngest of six children, Martha was raised in a working-class Catholic household by two first-generation Mexican Americans. She worked her way through community college, Cal State LA, and USC, holding jobs in research and special education support at the county Department of Mental Health. There, she saw firsthand how underfunded federal programs led to children falling behind and communities struggling.

After earning her Master's Degree in Social Work from USC and raising twin daughters as a single mother, Martha worked full-time at the Department of Mental Health and advanced into intergovernmental relations, advocating for stronger mental health and education policy. Her work helped support the passage of Proposition 63, which funds mental health services by taxing the top 1 percent.

Martha has served West Sacramento for over 20 years on city commissions, was elected to the City Council in 2018, and became Mayor in 2020. As mayor, she has strengthened flood protection, secured federal funding for public amenity investments in the oldest neighborhoods, supported small businesses, increased transparency, and expanded affordable housing and services to address homelessness.
